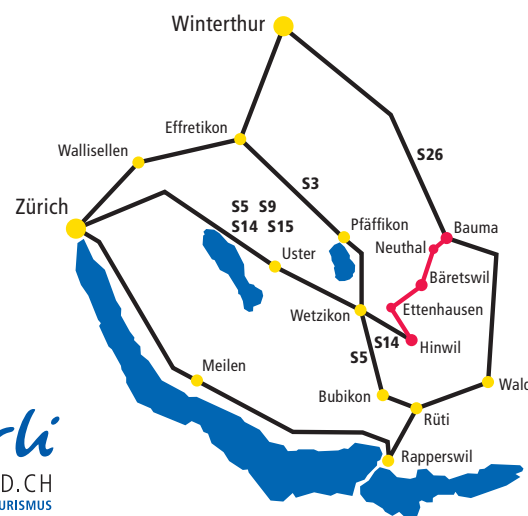

DVZO: The Dampfbahn-Verein Zürcher Oberland

Established in 1969, the Dampfbahn-Verein Zürcher Oberland (DVZO) has since 1978 operated heritage trains over the former tracks of the erstwhile Uerikon-Bauma-Bahn between Bauma-Bäretswil-Hinwil, whose regular services had ceased in the same year. Since 2000, the DVZO has taken over the ownership of the stretch between Bauma and Bäretswil and operates as a fully licensed railway company. The society also possesses the right to organise and run special charter trains throughout the whole of Switzerland. All active members of the society, including those carrying out maintenance on rolling stock and permanent way, work on a voluntary basis in their free time, so that you are able to experience the romanticism of rail travel from a bygone age for family-friendly prices.

Steam Trains in the Zürcher Oberland

Every first and third Sunday between May and October:

The departures from Bauma and Hinwil are from the main SBB station. All of our trains are hauled by steam engines coupled to a rake of original and fully restored 3rd class carriages dating from around 1900 plus a buffet car. At the main crossover point in Bäretswil, passengers are able in both directions to transfer directly onto the train going into the opposite direction.

Ticket Costs Bauma–Hinwil or vice versa

(reductions allowed on individual stages, prices incl. 8.0% VAT)
Fr. 20.– single Fr. 200.– personal season ticket
Fr. 35.– return

Tickets are obtainable until immediately prior to departure from either the ticket counter in Bäretswil, in the souvenir shop in Bauma or on the platform in Hinwil, as well as from the train personnel. Payment by card is only possible from the ZVV-/SBB automates at both Bauma and Hinwil. Dogs and bicycles are carried free of charge.

Limitations

The DVZO is exempt from timetable compliance. The company reserves the right to unavoidable delays, cancellations or substitution through diesel or electric traction as well as diversions over alternative routes in case of incidents occurring with rolling stock or permanent way. If there is a full cancellation of service, we will refund you the full cost of your DVZO ticket.

All children up to the age of 16 travel free when accompanied by an adult. One adult can accompany up to four children.

Seat Reservation

Our steam trains normally have enough places to cater for everyone. Consequently, we do not offer seat reservations for single travellers or small groups in our historical 3rd class carriages. However, we are able to make table reservations in the buffet car when you wish to enjoy a tasty snack.

Group Travel

For groups of 10 or more, we are happy to reserve your desired seats on board the train, subject to availability. Please make sure to contact us prior to your visit so that we are more able to fulfil your wishes. The same prices as for single travellers apply for groups. Apart from the usual scheduled services, it is also possible to hire one of our heritage trains with a total capacity of 400 exclusively for your group at a flat rate.

Charters

We offer groups the possibility to exclusively charter our trains year round. You can choose between steam or historical electric traction to haul your train, as well as opting to venture beyond the realms of our main line between Bauma–Hinwil.
